Our electives are a work in progress. Opening with only 6ht graders and opening with a relatively small group of students provides some challenges as well as some opportunities. We discussed some of the possible electives that could be offered to our students. All students will take PE and Digital Tools as two of their electives. The name of digital tools may change but the core curriculum will remain the same. At this time we are looking for the best model to deliver this content in. As a reminder all students will take PE and Digital tools each of which are year long courses. The other electives will depend on teachers and what we can fit in to a schedule. Our hope is to be able to offer a wider selection of offerings this year. Bu the offerings would have limited access. Please remember this is all in a draft form.

Core Courses

- Core Academics will hire 5 core teachers Math, ELA, Science, Social Studies
- Non Core Academics(Electives) will hire 2 noncore teachers – PE and Critical Thinking/Research

All students will be in the 4 core offerings listed. We generate 5 teachers for core subjects and 2 elective teachers. Students take 4 core and 3 electives. The difference in the core and elective teachers and what we generate is what will hopefully allow is to provide a great variety of elective offerings.



For English Language Arts, Science and World History all have one of two options: either Advanced or Standard. A child does not have to take Advanced World History if they are in Advanced ELA. All these courses can be mixed. Regardless of if your child is in an Advanced or a Standard class, the content is the same. They are working with the same standards and the assessments are the same. Math is different.

All St. Johns County school only offer Basketball and Volleyball through the school. Other sports are offered though SJMSAA. Please see the Athletics tab on the FCA website for more information. For the 2018-19 S.Y., FCA will only have a 6th grade basketball and volleyball team. They will compete with the other K-8 schools against their 6th grade teams. In coming years the 6th grade team will be dissolved as we move to a Middle school team competing against other middle school teams. If your child is interested in playing a different sport, they can play with the school they would have attended in the 2018-19 school year if FCA had not been built. For example if your child would have attended Fruit Cove Middle, they can try out for the FCMS teams that are associated with SJMSAA. Please contact SJMSAA if you have any further questions.

Daily Schedule

- 7 Period Day 3 min passing period between classes
- Class Length 45 min periods M, T, TH, F
- Wednesday Schedule 30 min periods with a built in intervention/enrichment block
- Lunch 30 min daily embedded 6th period
 - Students will have middle school lunch options and a la carte items(see current middle school lunch menu for sample)
- Students report to homeroom/1st period each day by 8:30am for important morning announcements
 - Warning bell rings 8:25am

FCA will run on the traditional Elementary School day schedule.

We want to make middle school a special experience for our students at FCA. During lunch, as long as everything is as expected, students will be able to sit where they would like with whom they would like. We have ordered round tables so they can sit with a group of friends. We have created spaces on the upper floors for the middle school students to have comfortable seating. A place for them to gather before school starts that is different from the elementary school experience. We will also allow our students to have one earbud in their ears to listen to music or their recorded notes from class (we can hope). The other earbud is subject to inspection and all music must be appropriate for school. No wireless earbuds or head[phones will be allowed, and please keep them of the cheap variety. A select group of Middle School students will be asked to form an Advisory Group to help guide the school. Middle school students will have lockers and will be expected to rent a lock from the school. We will have uniforms for P.E. FCA P.E. uniforms will be available for purchase once the school year begins. Extended Day and After school programs will also be available for our middle school students, more information will come. Student Forms

Student forms with class recommendation and elective offerings will be sent to your child at their current school. These forms will then be returned to the current school. FCA will then collect them and begin assigning students to classes. If there are any questions, changes or concerns school staff will contact you over the summer.


Advanced Course Placement Criteria


The following criteria represent consensus of all middle school and district administrators:

- Grades A grade of C or better in the previous honors or advanced course, or students earning a grade of A in the previous standard course
 OR
- FSA Level 4 or 5 in appropriate area and not less than a Level 3 in any area
 - On Mathematics FSA for placement in honors or advanced mathematics.
 - On Reading FSA for placement in honors or advanced English, social studies, science, or foreign language;
- In the case of extenuating circumstances, petition may be made on a case-by-case basis to the principal (or designee) for review of criteria to ensure proper course placement.
