At the current time it looks like Michael may bring us a wet dismissal later this week. The rest of this section is for your information, it is not to imply anything. Freedom Crossing Academy was built to be a Hurricane Shelter. The past couple of years we did close schools for educational purposes and opened several as shelters. The plan for FCA if it were to open as a shelter would be to open it for those that require medical treatments. Timberlin Creek Elementary is also a local shelter that also accepts pets. If there is potential weather the school district works very closely with several Emergency Services. FCA would not be open to the general public. We get updates on conditions and any impact, as we currently are with Michael. Again, I will communicate any important information pertaining to school as it is received. If schools were open as shelters, please understand that the reopening of schools is dependent on the transitioning from shelters back to being school ready. Let's hope all this is just for your information and we will not have to put it into practice.

The message above was prepared earlier to go out today. As I entered the building today, the weather alert was going warning of high winds. I was thankful that our staff had already taken the steps needed to keep our students safe. In our building there is very little that we do different, our goal is to keep the day as normal as possible. This is a benefit of the construction of the building. We do monitor all situations and adjust as needed.

FCA Storybook Pumpkin Patch!



Dear Parents, Students, and Teachers:

Freedom Crossing Academy is growing a storybook pumpkin patch and we need your help! FCA students, staff, and parents are invited to decorate a pumpkin to look like their favorite book Character. It's easy and fun for everyone! Bring a decorated pumpkin to school during the week of October 16 -19 and we will keep them on display in the Media Center until October 32st!

Rules and Guidelines:

1. <u>NO CARVED PUMPKINS</u>? Carved pumpkins rot, attract bugs, and smell. Pumpkins may be painted, hot glued, colored and decorated. Acrylic paints and permanent markers work well. Watercolors tend to run. Other options include yarn, buttons, googly eyes, etc. Gourds and other pumpkin-like squash may also be used. Carved/cut pumpkins will be sent home or discarded!

2. Pumpkins should represent a favorite **book CharaCter**. On the entry form, write the <u>title</u> and <u>author</u> of the book and include a Copy of the book (or a printout of the book's Cover) to display with the pumpkin CharaCter. (Do an online search for "storybook pumpkins" for ideas! Pinterest has TONS of great examples!)

3. You Can make your own storybook pumpkin, or you Can team up with a friend, neighbor, Classmate, or sibling! Even better, make it a family project!!

4. Write your full name(s) on the BOTTOM of your pumpkin AND on your entry form!

5. Pumpkins will be on display from October 16 until October 31^{st} . All pumpkins must be brought home on or before October 31^{st} . Pumpkins that are not picked up will be disposed of.
