Social Media – Over the past few weeks we have dealt with a few issues that started with Social Media. It is our hope that we can partner with our families to help our children navigate this new arena. The issues that we have had to deal with occurred outside of school, but have had an impact on the school day. As a school 6<sup>th</sup> graders may listen to music or an audio book outside of the classroom. All personal electronic devices may be used in the classroom only under the direction of the teacher. Today's technology can be a great tool, we want to help our students use it in appropriate ways. As a school we have and will continue to teach about use and safety with Electronic devices. In a couple weeks, we will also offer an after-school club for  $4^{th} - 6^{th}$  graders on Social Media (more on that later). Safety at FCA - As we have many new families that have joined us, I wanted to send out some safety items. Please know that <u>everyone</u> must be an approved volunteer and show ID in order to enter the building. We hold several drills during the year. These drills include monthly fire drills. We also hold High Winds, Lockdown, and evacuations drills two times each year. One change that we are making is to assign a random individual the responsibility of calling a drill. This way we all go through the process as if it were an actual event. We believe this will help us learn and better prepare. Earlier this year we went over some 'Always Rules' with our students and gave presentations in conjunction with local Law Enforcement. We have attached the "Always Rules' for your review as well.

New School – With the new school we know we have some issues that we will continue to work through. Recently we discovered that a part that was used for our swings was part of a recall. We immediately closed the swings and have had the part replaced. Currently, we are working with contractor to get our fields in a condition for use.

Retest Policy – I recently met with some of our students. When asked about some things they are thankful for about FCA, several stated that they like the retake policy that we have. We are focused on our students learning the things that they need to know. We believe that a student's grade should be an accurate reflection of the knowledge they have. As we have been working through this we have determined that we cannot retest everything. We also recognize that there are certain standards that are more important than others. Currently, out teams are working on determining those critical elements at each grade level. In order to allow teams time to focus on what is most important, they are being given the opportunity to focus on the most important standards and only retest on those items. This is a much longer conversation, but know our goal at FCA is to prepare our students with the skills they will need to be successful in their future.

Counselor's Corner: We will be partnering with the Monique Burr Foundation for Children to deliver a program called Child Safety Matters during our guidance lessons with our K-5<sup>th</sup> grade students. The lessons will begin in a few weeks. Please be on the look-out for a permission slip coming home with your student. This comprehensive program is research-based and follows best practices for prevention education. Talking points revolve around staying safe, which will include bullying, cyberbullying, all types of child abuse, digital abuse, and other digital dangers. Each of the four lessons is grade appropriate. Information and follow-up activities will be sent home twice throughout the program for you to talk with your student about at home.


