Applications for the summer Marine Science Program can still be downloaded at any time from the website prior to April 15<sup>th</sup> at <u>http://www-grms.stjohns.k12.fl.us/marinescience/</u> The link also will have a complete day by day curriculum for each grade level, parent information, and a video from last year's program. Please return the application to your child's science teacher to be forwarded to our program.

This summer program is available to all students currently in grades five through seven and has been sponsored by the school district since 1982. Three eight day sessions are held at Gamble Rogers Middle School with bus transportation provided. The dates for the three sessions this summer will be May 29<sup>th</sup> through June 7<sup>th</sup>, June 10<sup>th</sup> through June 20<sup>st</sup>, and June 24<sup>th</sup> through July 3<sup>rd</sup>. Small classes of 13-15 students are separated by grade level. All instructors in the program are St. Johns County School District teachers.

The Marine Science Program is a carefully designed experience for responsible students who are interested in learning about our local marine environments. Learning is "hands on" in the field with students kayaking, canoeing, boating, hiking, snorkeling, sailing, windsurfing, surfing, SUP, (stand up paddleboarding), etc. Specific grade level activities and curriculum are attached to the applications and are also available from the website.

## "Hacking STEM" Summer Camp

#### Summer, 2019

Campers will be mentored by UNF Students participating in intercollegiate, collaborative, and authentic STEM projects. Campers will have the opportunity to learn coding, hacking, and making skills in computer science, engineering, and advanced applied mathematics while building STEM tools to participate in grade-level-specific projects related to our STEP Lab Social Justice projects.

JUNE 3-7, 2019: (Grades 3-6) HACKING AGRICULTURAL RESOURCES

Elementary School students will be engaged in Hacking Stem Lessons, Minecraft Edu., and Lego Robotic lessons that will integrate STEM curriculum. Students will build trundle wheels. learn to interpret streaming data, and learn to build and interpret 3D models of drone photographic data. Students will construct actual organic gardens, thereby learning the math, science and technology associated with this task. We will give consideration for equitable food distribution and production in rural communities.

#### JUNE 10- 14, 2019: (Grades 6-9) HACKING WATER RESOURCES

Middle school students will be engaged in Hacking Stem Lessons, Minecraft Edu., and Lego Robotics, along with WozU drone and integrated STEM lessons. Students will build dissolved oxygen sensors and sonar equipment. They will learn to 3D model waterways and river bottoms- essentially conducting civil engineering projects.

#### JUNE 17-21 & 24-28: (Grades 9-12) HACKING MEDICAL RESOURCES

High School students will be engaged in Hacking STEM Lessons, and roboticsintegrated STEM lessons. Students will build robotic hands, 3D- printed hands, and invent robotic 3D-printed assistive technology for specified individuals from our community.
