## **Curriculum Update:**

#### Interims

Interims are a snapshot of the progress your student is making midway through the nine weeks. Interims should be available to view HAC September 12<sup>th</sup> for 1<sup>st</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Parents ae always welcome to reach out to your child's teacher to schedule a parent conference if more detailed information is needed regarding your child's progress.

#### **Curriculum Overview**

Kindergarten through 5th grade PLCs, Professional Learning Communities, send weekly newsletters to keep parents informed about lessons, class activities and events. This school year, grade levels will be sending out a PowerPoint or video during the week of the September 26<sup>th</sup>, highlighting the curriculum used for your child's grade level; Middle School will share this information via Schoology.

#### Algebra I

If you have a student currently enrolled in Algebra I, Ms. Stanfield will be hosting a informational Q & A session this <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>9/12/23 at 6:00PM</u> in the FCA Cafeteria. The purpose of the meeting is to discuss course content, grading policy and understanding taking a high school credit course.

### **Progress Monitoring:**

The Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) is a progress monitoring system that is administered three times per year to track your student's progress in learning the Benchmarks of Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) Standards throughout this school year. Progress Monitoring will happen 3 times per year. Parents should have received a detailed notice form your child's home room teacher. - Grades K-1 will take the Renaissance Star Early Literacy Assessment
- Grade 2 will take the Renaissance Star Reading Assessment
- Grades 3 -8 will take the Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST)

#### **Progress Monitoring Parent Reports**

This will always be different for grade levels, as students test in the same window, but not at the same time.

Students may not use a wireless communication device during instructional time except when expressly directed by a teacher solely for educational purposes. ## Safety -Arrival and Dismissal

#### School start time is 8:00AM.

We appreciate your help in getting your students to school on time. Please be mindful that students that arrive after 8:00AM are tardy and missing valuable class time. Additionally, we are so thankful to have our amazing **Patrols** on duty each morning and afternoon. Please know that patrols and staff members will begin unloading students at **7:40AM**.

A few things that can help us move the car lines and keep everyone safe. In the morning:

- For safety, always exist on the right passenger side of the vehicle.
- Remind students to walk on the right side of the sidewalk.
- Students backpacks and items should be ready to grab upon exit.
- Staff and patrols will assist with younger students exiting the vehicles.
- Please pull all the way up and follow the directions of staff directing cars.
- Please be mindful of cell phone use during this time.
- No cars should pull into the bus loop for any reason. Drop Off and Pickup should be in the Parent/Pickup and Drop Off location in the front of the school.

#### In afternoon: PLEASE NOTE THE SAFTEY CONCERN BELOW

- School Crossing Guards will be posted at Longleaf and Shetland Dr. from 7:25AM to 8:00AM and in the afternoon 2:23PM to 2:53PM. It has been brought to our attention that students are crossing to the school before the PSAs/Crossing Guards take their posts and not making not making use of the Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon.
- Kindergarten and 1<sup>st</sup> grade Biker/Walkers must be picked up by a parents, guardian or sibling and should have a red lanyard to show staff members.
- Biker and Walkers should ONLY cross where there is a Crossing Guard. Please talk to your older children about this safety concern.
- Bikers should always wear a helmet for safety.
- When in the Parent Pickup line, please pull all the way up even if the cone number called does not match up. This is improving the efficiency of our lines.

### **Safety – Required Drills**

Below is a list of required drills to be held throughput the school year for the safety of our students, we do not advertise the dates and times of the drills. Teachers are notified to help prepare students. I generally walk students through the 1<sup>st</sup> set of drills. If you happen to get caught in a drill when arriving or picking up, we will be sure to include you in the safety protocols and ask for your patience during this time.

**Required Drills:** 

1 fire drill with in the 1<sup>st</sup> 10 days of school
1 fire drill per month w/ 2 occurring within the first 30 days of school
1 active assailant drill per month
1 bomb/evacuation drill per semester
1 tornado/weather drill per semester
2 bus evacuation drills
